

MAGNY-COURS CIRCUIT

RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR USERS AND GUESTS

These rules apply to the users of the circuit and their guests, of whom the users are held responsible.

The fact of entering the grounds of the Circuit of Magny-Cours as a group or as an individual, implies acceptance without reservation of all the following internal regulations.

1/ General behavior in the circuit

The site is guarded from 07:00 to 20:00 every day of the week (except during winter period).

It is forbidden to bring animals onto the site, except a dog accompanying the holder of a disability card valid in the country of origin of the holder.

Children under age 18 must be supervised by a responsible adult to enter the site.

Every person within the circuit must possess identity papers.

Public drunkenness is forbidden.

Disrespectful or aggressive behavior towards anybody is forbidden.

Fluid spilling is forbidden; garbage must be placed in the disposal units/areas only.

The system of giving priority to traffic coming from the right is applicable within the circuit.

It is forbidden to block any driveway within the circuit.

Water use within the circuit may be restricted should a prefectorial order limiting water consumption be decreed.

If passes are to be granted, users and their guests will have to show theirs at any check; access to areas requiring an appropriate pass will be refused to passless users and guests.

It is forbidden to take photographs or produce videos within the circuit for advertising or commercial purposes, except on the basis of a written agreement from the SAEMS.

Goods selling are submitted to written agreement from the circuit.

It is forbidden to undermine the circuit's image.

It is forbidden to express racist or discriminatory opinions of any kind, on whatever visual aids : clothes, posters, banderols, etc.

2/ Regarding the track:

Every driver must sign the circuit liability disclaimer, and the organiser must submit all these signed liability disclaimers to the Chef de Piste before taking to the track.

Drivers are responsible for their behaviour on the track and any risks that they may take at the controls of their vehicles.

The circuit cannot be held responsible should an accident between users, or caused by an user occur.

Users must not jeopardize other users' or anybody's life by behaving dangerously or inadequately.

It is forbidden to stop one's vehicle on the track.

It is forbidden to intentionally crash into another vehicle on the track.

It is forbidden to walk across the track.



In the event of an engine failure or collision, the track user must do their best to park their vehicle on the verge as far as possible from the track.

Users must respect the instructions given to them by the track personnel and the track stewards.

Users must respect the lights and flags waved by the track stewards.

Users will be held responsible of any damage they might cause to the infrastructures, and be committed to pay the price of the related repairs on the premises.

It is forbidden to smoke while driving a vehicle on the track.

It is forbidden to drive after drinking alcohol.

It is strictly forbidden to use GoPro-type cameras on motorbikes; this is only acceptable inside closed cars.

It is forbidden to take drunk guests to the track.

Burnouts (rubber burnings) and drift are forbidden.

No children under age 16 can get to the track except in the case of exceptional and specific sporting regulations.

3/ Regarding the pits driveway

The speed in the pit lane is limited to 60 kph except in the case of exceptional and specific sporting regulations.

It is prohibited for children less than 16 years of age, even accompanied, to cross the pit lane except in the case of exceptional and specific sporting regulations.

All persons present in the pit lane must wear closed shoes and covering garments.

Smoking on the pits driveway is forbidden.

It is forbidden to paint marks; ground marks must be made with adhesive tapes.

4/ Regarding the garages

The new fire-safety precautions require the presence of emergency push buttons in the garages. These buttons are very sensitive and are active for a minimum of 5 minutes. We therefore recommend the utmost vigilance.

Garages are supposed to have been found in good state; user is therefore committed to leave the used garage in perfect state.

Garages must be cleaned up after use.

User will be billed on the premises for any damage caused to the rented garage.

It is forbidden to paint marks, or to drill holes.

A safety corridor behind the garages must be kept clear of all obstructions.

Waste oil must be placed in the containers provided for this purpose under the stairwells behind the garages.

No garbage, no equipment should be left in the garages.

It is forbidden to smoke in the garages.

It is forbidden to light a barbecue in the garages and in the vicinity of the garages.

It is forbidden to film or take pictures of a garage rented by another user without the latter's consent.

It is forbidden to enter a garage rented by another user without the latter's consent.



The circuit will not be held responsible in the event of theft or damages caused to the user's property in the garage they rent.

5/ Regarding the paddocks

Garbage must be placed in the appropriate disposal units.

No equipment should be left behind after using a paddock.

It is forbidden to smoke within a 2-meter radius from another user's space.

It is forbidden to smoke within a 10-meter radius from the gas station.

Users must leave the lavatories as clean as they were found.

It is forbidden to drill holes into the ground, or into the electric posts.

It is forbidden to paint marks on the ground.

It is forbidden to waste water or electricity.

The use of barbecues is discouraged and under the full responsibility of the user. It is forbidden to light a barbecue within a metre of a tent.

It is forbidden to have a barbecue within a one-meter radius from a tent.

It is forbidden to light a fire.

Every user will be assigned a specific space to park their vehicles and their guests' by the circuit.

Should an user's granted space not be respected, the circuit would be entitled to have the vehicles, motor-homes or tents moved to any place they would choose at the offender's expense.

Except in the event of a meeting involving specific timetable adjustments, it is forbidden to make noise from 10 p.m. to 8 a.m..

Outside lights must be switched off from 10 p.m. to 8 a.m..

It is forbidden to film or take pictures of another user without the latter's consent.

The circuit will not be held responsible in the event of theft or damages caused to a user's property left in the garage they rent.

6/ Regarding the safety lanes

All access to the safety lanes around the circuit is regulated.

Access to the safety lanes is granted only to circuit vehicles driven by a circuit employee, after agreement from the track manager.

Only accredited people and vehicles are allowed.

It is forbidden to leave garbage on the safety lanes and their surroundings.

7/ Regarding the circuit's direction building

It is forbidden to smoke inside the building.

Any person entering the administrative building must be checked at reception.

Direct access to any administrative department is forbidden.

Any person wishing to access to an administrative department must tell the greeter the reason for their presence and the circuit representative they would like to meet. The greeter will then warn the concerned department, which will send an employee to take charge of the visitor.

It is forbidden to run in the corridors.



Access to the race direction is forbidden.

8/ Regarding the parking areas

It is forbidden to dig holes into the ground, or to light fires.

It is forbidden to leave garbage or to pollute the ground.

It is forbidden to leave equipment behind.

9/ Applicable penalties

In general, the public are requested to avoid causing any disturbance to the smooth running of events, or to their visit to the sports venue and the surrounding areas, by their behaviour, their dress or their remarks, and to observe the safety guidelines.

Offenders may be expelled from the sports venue and its surrounding areas. In the event of a repeat offence, the organizer or the manager reserves the right to seek permanent legal exclusion notwithstanding the application where appropriate of the provisions of article L.332-11 of the French Sporting Code.
